June 9th, Fort Benton, MT

The 2016 River Rendezvous will be hosted by Chouteau County Conservation District, June 9th, on the Missouri River near Fort Benton, MT. Rendezvous attendees will take a boat tour of riparian fencing projects, cottonwood planting sites, and other riparian enhancement efforts. Landowners and partners will speak about the challenges and opportunities for riparian restoration and enhancement along the Missouri River. Experts will report on bird and fish habitat enhancement efforts and the importance of partnerships to any successful restoration and enhancement effort.
